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Choosing the Right Camp For You

Family Fare Well Breakfast: A favorite for all our resident camps is the Family Breakfast served on the last day of camp. Before campers and families say their goodbyes and head home from an awesome week of camp, we invite everyone into the dining hall for a delicious breakfast buffet. The pancake breakfast starts at 9am on the Saturday of pick-up and the cost is \$7 for adults and \$5 for kids 3 and older and Camp Whitewood campers eat for free! An email for RSVP will be sent out in the middle of the camping week.

4-H County Camps: Junior campers stay very busy at camp, enjoying campfires, singing, crafts, hiking, swimming, shooting sports, boating, games and much more. Each of our week-long County Camp sessions is hosted by one or more of our county OSU Extension Staff, giving each week a new twist. **Campers do not need to be in 4-H or live in a certain county to attend any of our County Camps.**

Explorer Camp: All the fun in half the time! Explorer Camp is a half-week program designed for campers who are new to camp and/or might not want to stay for a whole week. Age limits for this camp are 7-12 so it is also a good chance for a younger camper to try camp. Campers will still do all the camp activities such as swimming, boating, crafts, hiking, fishing, creek walking, archery and so much more! Camp 1 is a Tuesday night pick up after the Family Bonfire. Camp 2 and 3 are Mornig pick ups after the Family Breakfast.

Junior Camp: Classic summer camp! Junior camp is a week-long resident camp for ages 7-12. It is focused on a variety and balance of activities, including: swimming, boating, crafts, hiking, fishing, creek walking, archery and more.

Juniorcampers will be engaged during evening programming such as campfires, vespers and all-game activities.

Senior Camp: Camp experience for older campers. Senior camp is for ages 13-16 and is focused on a more social setting with an emphasis on advanced skills in camp programs and developing leadership skills. Senior campers have more choice in programs and participate in camp activities as well as specially designed senior camp activities. This is the perfect camp for a camper in-between Junior Camp and a Leader-In-Training.

Leader-In-Training (LITs): LIT is for individuals 16-18 that love Camp Whitewood and are ready to take the next step in regards to responsibility, leadership and becoming role models for younger campers. As an LIT you must have a desire to serve others. LITs receive one-on-one training with Program Staff learning what it takes to become a Staff Member and developing leadership skills, program skills and responsibility. This is the perfect program for 4-H counselors interested in further opportunities at Camp Whitewood or anyone interested in someday joining the Camp Whitewood staff. To be accepted into the LIT program you will have to submit three character references and conduct an interview with a Camp Whitewood Director. There are a limited number of spots in the LIT program, so sign up now!

Shooting Sports Camp: Do you love archery, riflery and atlats!?! Want to spend more time learning and practicing all of the shooting sports!?! Then Shooting Sports Camp is for you! Spend time each day focusing on archery, atlats, riflery and shotguns. Along with our trained Camp Whitewood staff, we bring in experts in each discipline to mentor and teach campers proper safety and technique. Along with shooting sports, campers will still enjoy all of the other activities they love about camp such as swimming, boating, hiking and evening programs. Shooting Sports Camp is for ages 10-16 with LIT positions available for ages 16-18.

Wilderness Camp: Wilderness camp is a true outdoor camping experience. Campers are led by Wilderness Camp staff into the less explored parts of Whitewood and sleep in tents in a backcountry setting. Wilderness campers learn how to set up camp, outdoor cooking skills, wilderness skills, and outdoor camping ethics. Campers are provided with backpacks, tents, sleeping gear, cooking gear, and food. Please call or visit the website for more information about Wilderness Camp and check out the packing list and suggestions. Restrooms and showers will not be used till the last day, so campers will learn proper backcountry bathroom and hygiene techniques. Wilderness Camp is a half-week program. Space is limited and fills up fast, so register early!

Level 2 Wilderness Camp: Level 2 Wilderness Camp is for all you outdoor buffs that just cannot get enough Wilderness Camp. Campers will learn more advanced wilderness and survival skills as well as exploring parts of Camp Whitewood most people don't even know exist! It is highly recommended that a camper go through Wilderness Camp or be experienced in primitive camping before registering for Level 2 Wilderness Camp.
